SILVER CERTIFICATION FOR THE INTERPRETIVE CENTER

The final piece of the puzzle was placed on Friday April 24, 2009 when participants gathered at the Interpretive Center at the Six Mile Cypress Slough Preserve to celebrate the presentation of the US Green Building Council Leadership in Energy and Environment Design (LEED) Silver Plaque. LEED is an internationally recognized certification program and a benchmark for the design, construction and operation of high performance "green" buildings. The Interpretive Center is one of only 42 LEED certified new construction projects in Florida and the first LEED certified new public building construction in Lee and Collier Counties.

The Interpretive Center was certified as a green building because it demonstrates the whole building approach to sustainability by performance in key areas. Some of these key areas include a sustainable site, water efficiency, energy and atmosphere, materials and resources, and awareness and education. Some of the specifics about the Interpretive Center include the fact that it was build on an old road bed creating a minimum disturbance of the land, native plants were used in areas that were disturbed, the ceiling is of bamboo, a rapidly renewable resource. The boardwalk and deck are made of a recycled lumber called Trex (made from grocery bags and pallet wraps along with recycled wood.)

Rainwater is collected from the roof into a cistern that is then used to flush the toilets and irrigate plantings. Indoor lighting is all fluorescent and activated by motion detectors and will turn off automatically if no movement is detected in a room. Sunlight is available throughout the building to light rooms. The windows can also be opened to allow fresh air into the building. Numerous individuals and organizations are responsible for the dream and the eventual completion of the fabulous Interpretive Center. The list is long but includes Lee County Board of County Commissioners, Ray Judah, Tammy Hall, Bob Janes, Frank Mann and Brian Bigelow, Lee County Parks and Recreation, South Florida Water Management District, all of the Friends and volunteers at the Slough, the professional groups including Parker/Mudgett/Smith Architects, Inc., GATES, Johnson Engineering, TLC Engineering, Bob Rude Structures, Inc., Rob Andrys Architecture, Worthington Communities, Gates Butz Institutional Construction, Inc., Trifecta Construction Solutions and the CITIZENS OF LEE COUNTY.


